Class 1	Potatoes – white	1 plate of 5. Plate provided.
Class 2	Potatoes – coloured	1 plate of 5. Plate provided.
Class 3	Leeks	1 plate of 2.
Class 4	Leeks – pot	1 plate of 2.
Class 5	Onions	1 plate of 3. Each onion <b>must not</b> exceed 250g. Plate provided.
Class 6	Onions	1 plate of 3. Each onion <b>must</b> exceed 250g. Plate provided.
Class 7	Onions – heaviest	1 exhibit of 1.
Class 8	Onions – spring	1 plate of 6. Plate provided.
Class 9	Shallots	1 plate of 6. To be presented on plate of sand. Plate provided.
Class 10	Parsnips	1 plate of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 11	Beetroot – round	1 plate of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 12	Beetroot – cylindrical	1 plate of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 13	Cauliflower	1 plate of 1. Any variety. Root stem trimmed to 76mm (3in).
Class 14	Cabbage	1 plate of 1. Any variety. Root stem trimmed to 76mm.
Class 15	Carrots – short (under 6 inches)	1 plate of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 16	Carrots – long (over 6 inches)	1 plate of 3. Tops trimmed to 76mm (3in) approx. Plate provided.
Class 17	Cucumbers	1 plate of 1. Plate provided.
Class 18	Tomatoes – cherry	1 plate of 6 (variety must be specified on the display label).
Class 19	Tomatoes – medium	1 plate of 5 (variety must be specified on the display label).
Class 20	Tomatoes – large	1 plate of 3 (variety must be specified on the display label).
Class 21	Tomatoes – truss	25% or more to be ripe.
Class 22	Pepper – sweet	1 plate of 2. Plate provided.
Class 23	Pepper – hot	1 plate of 6. Plate provided.
Class 24	Lettuce	1 plate of 1. Plate provided.
Class 25	Courgettes	1 plate of 3. 150mm (6in) long approx. Plate provided.
Class 26	Beans – runner	1 exhibit of 6. Presented on black cloth. Cloth provided.
Class 27	Beans – French	1 exhibit of 6. Presented on black cloth. Cloth provided.
Class 28	Beans – longest	1 exhibit of 1. Presented on black cloth. Cloth provided.
Class 29	Peas	1 plate of 6. Plate provided.
Class 30	Marrow – heaviest	1 exhibit of 1.
Class 31	Rhubarb	3 sticks, leaves removed.

Class 32	Herbs	3 named varieties. Presented in a vase.
Class 33	Pumpkin – heaviest	1 exhibit of 1.
Class 34	Funny veg and caption	1 veg and caption.
Class 35	Flowers – mixed vase	Vase of mixed flowers.
Class 36	Flowers – vase of four	Vase of 4 exhibits, 3 stems of each.
Class 37	Best tray of veg	Maximum of 6 different vegetables. Tray provided.
Class 38	Best tray of specified veg	5 potatoes, 2 leeks, 3 onions (must not exceed 250g), 4 beetroot, 5 medium tomatoes. Tray provided.
Class 39	Apples	1 plate of 4. Plate provided.
Class 40	Pears	1 plate of 4. Plate provided.
Class 41	Bowl / Basket of fruit	
Class 42	Sunflower – tallest	Measured in situ on plot.

## Rules for show

- 1 Staging of entries between 10:30am and 12:30pm.
- 2 Judging will commence at 1:00pm.
- 3 Exhibitors must collect staging tickets from the Show Secretary's table on arrival; these are to be placed face down with each exhibit.
- 4 As far as possible exhibits should be named but any incorrect names or omissions will not disqualify.
- 5 The judge's decision shall be final; judges are empowered to withhold awards where exhibits are considered to be of insufficient merit.
- 6 Whilst every precaution will be taken to safeguard exhibits the Association cannot be held responsible for loss or damage.
- 7 Exhibitors are only allowed one entry per class.
- 8 Points will be awarded as follows: 1st 4 points; 2nd 2 points; 3rd 1 point.
- 9 Any exhibitor protesting against any exhibit or exhibitor must do so in writing to the Show Secretary with a deposit of £1 no later than two hours after the show opens for viewing. Should the protest not be admitted in the opinion of the committee the deposit will be forfeited.
- 10 Any matters not provided for in these rules and any questions of interpretation shall be referred to the committee whose decision will be final.
